Upon review of Defendant/Third-Party Plaintiff, Dollar Tree Stores, Inc.'s Motion for Judgment on the Pleadings to dismiss Plaintiff Diane G. Martin's Complaint, the Motion is Denied. Contrary to Dollar Tree's arguments, the elements of duty and causation are well pled in the Complaint. Further, Dollar Tree's reliance on Howe v. Stubbs, 570 A.2d 1203 (Me. 1990) to support dismissal is misplaced. Howe was a summary judgment case, decided after a factual record was developed. Here, the Complaint's factual allegations, viewed in the light most favorable to Plaintiff, are sufficient to withstand the Motion for Judgment on the Pleadings.
